## Secretarial students embark on business training project

SECRETARIAL students from Business School began an entrepreneurship training as a preparation prior to embarking on a business project, the first-ever for the students.

The Saudah group, consisting of 10 final year students of the Business School under the Brunei Darusslam Technical and Vocational Education Council (BDTVEC) National Diploma Programme, attended the first-ever business training project with the aim of obtaining necessary knowledge and skills they have not covered during their two years of Secretarial Studies.

The project primarily deals with selling of health products from Bio Greeno Malaysia. However, the group aims to go beyond the business project assessment and start a long-term business, turning their dreams into a reality.

"It's a challenge for us to catch up with the Business and Finance students.
